4. 17TH SIPC – LONDRINA/PR, BRASIL: 15TH TO 19TH OCTOBER 2018

The Research Groups led by professors Tony Honorato (UEL-Londrina) and Célio Juvenal Costa (UEM-Maringá), will organize edition 17th of the International Symposium on Civilising Processes that will take place in the Universidade Estadual de Londrina (UEL), Brazil, October 2018.

UEL is located in the city of Londrina, Paraná State, in the southern region of Brazil. In the University, the local Organising Commission, constituted by members from UEL and UEM (Universidade Estadual de Maringá), will have the support of the Postgraduate Programs of both Universities, besides the Research Group on Civilising Processes and the Laboratory of Studies on the Portuguese Empire (LEIP).

The 17th SIPC will occur in the month of October 2018 and will have the presentation of research in the following formats: Conference, Coordinated Tables, Oral Communication, Workshop and Mini-Courses. The event is hoping to gather up to 200 researchers from different fields of knowledge, in forty hours of academic activities.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR ARTICLE SUBMISSION

SESSION FORMATS:

A) Coordinated Table Session: space for the presentation of articles about concluded research/studies, essays, reviews and thesis. In the Coordinated Table each participant will have 20 minutes to present, with a debate at the end of presentations. The Coordinated Table Session should be proposed considering the following indicators:

- Composed by 3 or 4 researchers who have completed their PhDs;
- Amongst the members of the table there should be at least one presenter from a different country;
- The Table proposal must be submitted by a coordinator that will send the title and participants of the Coordinated Table, and also the 3 or 4 abstracts (according to the general rules and deadlines) of each presenter;
- Each presenter must register in the Symposium and is responsible for the costs of his/her participation in the event, including registration fee;
- After the approval of the Coordinated Table, all participants must send the complete text, according to the general rules and deadlines.

Obs. The Organising and Scientific Commissions of the event, after receiving all submissions for oral communications can also, on the basis of thematic similarities, propose Coordinated Tables. As such, the authors that send abstracts without being part of a proposed coordinated table can also be included in the Coordinated Tables formed by the Commissions.

B) Oral Communication Session: space for the presentation of articles referring to either concluded or ongoing research/studies, essays, reviews, thesis and dissertations. In the Oral Communication, each participant will have fifteen (15) minutes to present, with a debate at the end of presentations. Registration of proposals for Communication will be made through an abstract, according to the general rules and deadlines. After approval, all presenters must send the full text and register according to general norms.

C) Workshop Session: space for the presentation of articles referring to the work of PhD, Masters and undergraduate students (scientific initiation), with a Prof. or Dr. that will comment/debate the text on the basis of previous reading. The Workshop Sessions will occur simultaneously and each participant will have fifteen (15) minutes to present and fifteen (15) minutes of debate, with free public access.

D) Book Launch Session: Authors interested in the presentation of their recently published works (last 3 years or not previously presented in previous SIPC's), should send an email to the Organising Commission (simposioelias2018@gmail.com) requesting participation in the Book Launch Session.

Obs. Each participant should indicate one option for the presentation of their article (Oral Communication, Workshop, Coordinated Table). The Scientific Commission is responsible for analysing and, when deemed adequate, suggest another format of presentation, including, in the case of oral communication, indication to Tables.

TECHNICAL ORIENTATION:

- The submitted proposals should be sent to: **simposioelias2018@gmail.com**
- In the Proceedings of the 17th Symposium and in the Research Group on Civilising Processes will only be published those works which are complete and effectively presented at the event.
- Independently of the format of the Session, each participant can send a maximum of one (1) article as main author and two (2) in co-authorship. Articles with more than three (3) authors are not accepted under any condition.
- The proposals will be evaluated according to the following criteria: adequacy to the theme of the Symposium; argumentative consistency; dialogue with the literature; appropriate language and format.

FORMAT (Coordinated Table, Oral Communication and Workshop)

- Languages: Texts will be accepted in Portuguese, Spanish and English.
- Abstract Format: The title should be in bold and in caps. Name(s) of the author(s), institution, title and email. It should have a minimum of 350 and maximum of 500 words, except bibliographical references. Single spacing, font type Times New Roman, size 12, normal paragraph without tabs, justified. In the sequence indicate three (3) key-words, that must be separated by a period between them. Send the proposal to: **simposioelias2018@gmail.com**
- Full Text Format: To participate in the event, all authors with accepted abstracts must send the full text to: **simposioelias2018@gmail.com**

Obs. The general norms for sending the full text will only be divulged after the approval of the submitted abstracts.

The Organising and Scientific Commissions do not take responsibility for eventual problems of any nature, including the presence of viruses, that make it impossible to open the files. The event does not take responsibility for the opinions, statements or questions made by the authors.

17th SIPC – OTHER INFORMATIONS

- The inauguration of the SIPC website is scheduled for December 2017.
- There is an interest in mobilising joint publications by national and foreigner researchers in books and journals, to be published during or after the event.
- Lastly, at UFES/2016, the final evaluation meeting established the payment of registration as a condition for the participation in the event, and that **all participants must pay independently of being a presenter, lecturer, or course tutor**. It has also defined that **each participant must seek alternatives for the payment of aerial passages and accommodation** next to the responsible organs

in their countries and universities, thus making the work of the Organising Commission of the 17th SIPC easier in times of economic recession.

JUNE

The research group “Education and Civilising Process”/GPEPC from the Universidade Federal da Grande Dourados/UFGD/MS, coordinated by prof. Magda Sarat, promoted the **9th Seminar of the Group on Education and Civilising Process: readings and dialogues with Norbert Elias** between the 28th and 29th June 2107. The event enjoyed the participation of colleagues discussing research from reading Norbert Elias. It also counted with the participation of researchers from several institutions: UBA, UEM, UEL, UFGD, UFPR and UNESPAR. In the occasion, a homage was paid to professor Ademir Gebara, for his participation in the Postgraduate Programme of UFGD.

AUGUST

A Coordinated Table took place in the **9th Brazilian Congress on the History of Education - "History of Education: global, national and regional"**, that took place in the Centro de Ciências Humanas, Letras e Artes of the Universidade Federal da Paraíba/UFPB, between the 15th and 18th August 2017, in the city of João Pessoa, Brazil. The Coordinated table was proposed in the 8th axis: “Theory of history and historiography of education”, and had as title: **History of Education and Civilising Processes: theories of Norbert Elias**, the objective was to present and discuss research on the history of education based on the theories of civilising processes and on the figurational research proposed by Norbert Elias. The work of Elias has been presenting itself to the historiography of education as a theoretical-methodological path that is pertinent to a greater approximation between the fields of Education, History and Sociology. In this occasion, four works were presented: 1) “The educational reforms in Portugal in the 16th century” by Célio J. Costa (UEM); 2) “Education in the childhood and history of women: contributions from Norbert Elias” by Magda Sarat (UFGD); 3) “Elias, Mozart and Honorato Faustino: for a history of the intellectuals of education” by Tony Honorato (UEL); 4) “Norbert Elias: education and the civilising of the parents” by Ricardo Lucena.

In the occasion, a meeting took place to discuss the organisation of the 17th SIPC, to take place in 2018.

SETEMBRO

As an outcome of the works present at the event 16th SIPC, that took place at UFES\2016 in Vitória\ES, the reception of book chapters for the organisation for the edited book “*Norbert Elias: Education, Politics and Social processes*”, to be published by the

Universidade Federal do Espírito Santo – EDUFES Press, in the second semester of 2018, was closed. Book launch is expected in the next 17th SIPC, Londrina.

NOVEMBER

The **Dossier “Norbert Elias and Education”**, was published in the thematic section of the **Journal Educação e Realidade from the Universidade Federal do Rio Grande do Sul**, organised by professor Magda Sarat (UFGD/) and by professor Reginaldo Celio Sobrinho (UFES). The publication has as its objective to contribute to the refinement of theoretical-methodological constructions that enhance research work in the field of education. **Six articles** were gathered, dedicated to the foundations of Figurational Sociology, that express distinct possibilities in the analysis of educational processes and respond to phenomena investigated by authors such as: Cas Wouters, Cynthia Greive Veiga, Magda Sarat, Miria Izabel Campos, Tony Honorato, Reginaldo Célio Sobrinho, Maria das Graças Silva Carvalho de Sá, Edson Pantaleão, Ricardo de Figueiredo Lucena.
